In my international experience as a Ph.D. scholar and post-doctoral research fellow in Australia, the UK, the USA and now Europe, I have developed meaningful collaborations to generate high-impact, quantitative and qualitative research outputs. In my Ph.D., I led the 'Mums and Dads (MAD) for Mealtimes' project set in Logan, a disadvantaged community, which aimed to understand the unique feeding concerns and family mealtime interactions between child, mother and fathers (who are rarely researched in the feeding literature).

 RESEARCH OUTPUT RELATIVE TO OPPORTUNITY

I completed my Ph.D. in 2018 and have been an active researcher for 3 years. During that time, I have worked in a Level A, Teaching and Research position (School of Medicine, UQ) and have experienced two international moves, first from Australia to the USA (Penn State University) and then to the Netherlands (Erasmus MC, Rotterdam). At Penn State I worked on several Randomized Controlled Trials in clinical and community settings, and gained skills in designing interventions and carrying out experiments in disadvantaged childcare setting (e.g. Head Start). I continue to collaborate with the Generation R Study research team at Erasmus MC, as a Marie-Curie fellow. This is a prospective cohort study from foetal life until young adulthood in a multi-ethnic urban population. In this role, I have gained skills in child developmental delays, longitudinal data analysis, causal inference and epigenetics.
